CLASS FORMAT: Interactive Lecture and Online Experience learning Premiere Pro

COURSE DESCRIPTION:


The course is designed for you to learn Premiere Pro CC and the advance features to create amazing video productions. This course will focus on helping students to create, edit, manipulate and manage digital imagery using Adobe CC products such as Photoshop, Illustrator, After Effects and finally Premiere Pro.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

At the end of this course the student should be able to implement and master the following:

- How to use and navigate Premiere Pro CC effectively to edit video created by the student
- To understand features and advance features to enhance video creations with Premiere Pro CC and other Adobe creative apps
- Demonstrate the ability to import, manipulate, and edit digital images including digital retouching
- Demonstrate the ability to work with imported text, graphics, and special effects in a designed layout
- Prepare digital imagery for exporting into other mediums and be able to manage color, sound, light and editing
- Prepare imagery for final outputs like social media
- Develop and utilize problem solving strategies to complete the creative process from the video creation to final output

Adobe Premiere Pro CC 2018
